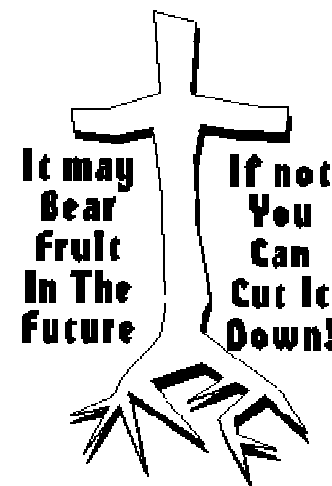

Third Sunday of Lent

Unless you repent you will all perish as they did

First Reading	Ex 3:1-8.13-15
Responsorial Psalm	Ps 102:1-4.6-8.11

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: When we take today's readings together they pose a challenge. First we hear how God reveals himself to Moses in the burning bush and promises to deliver his people from slavery into a land flowing with milk and honey. Then St Paul reminds his audience that receiving God's blessings and walking in his company does not guarantee that we will not go off the rails. A recent BBC history programme mentioned 'The Ranters' – a Seventeenth Century sect who believed that since they were 'saved' it didn't matter how they behaved! However, in the Gospel Our Lord warns against an easy assumption that those who suffer are being punished for their sins. The so-called 'Prosperity Gospel' is also a perversion of the truth. It is true that we are saved not by our own efforts but God's grace, but it is also true that God looks to us to produce the fruit of that grace in our lives. God is with us as he was with Moses, not in the burning bush but in the grace of the sacraments. If we feel the Lord would be disappointed with the fruit we are producing, we need to make the most of the graces we receive. Examining our consciences, allowing God to challenge us with the need for his forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation is one of the ways in which he digs over the soil so that his grace can transform us and make us more fruitful.

YOUTH WORK IN TIPTREE: After a number of meetings and discussions various things are under way in Tiptree to meet the needs of the many young people. A successful youth club has been started in Wilkins' premises, currently on Thursday evenings but hoping to run on other evenings too – 7.00-9.30 p.m. The Churches in Tiptree plan to follow the trail blazed by Coggeshall and to set up a Trust to employ a Christian Youth Worker so that there is a focus on the needs of the young people belonging to the Christian community and a level of outreach as well as purely secular provision. At the moment we need about five people who would be willing to serve as trustees and put their expertise to the benefit of young people in Tiptree. They do not need to work with young people but to provide the necessary financial, legal and administrative skills to run a trust and to work together to raise funds from various grant giving bodies. Ideally there would be a trustee from the Catholic community in the Tiptree area. If anyone would be willing to help in this way please let me know as soon as possible. Further down the line there will be a management committee to help support the youth worker, when taken on, and to give guidance and advice on priorities and practical matters. This will be a larger group and it would be helpful for them to be aware of local needs, and for some at least to have involvement with young people locally and to be able to give a 'Faith' input.

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY - Tiptree: As last year there will be Bible Study Groups during Lent on Tuesday evenings at the URC 8.00-9.00 p.m. and on Thursdays at St Luke's 11.00-12.00 noon (repeating Tuesday's subject). You can mix and match from one week to another. This Lent the subject will be a selection of parables from the Gospels.
