## Twenty-Eighth Sunday of Year

*No one has come back to give praise to God,  
except this foreigner.*

First Reading 2 Kg 5:14-17

Responsorial Psalm Ps 97:1-4

Second Reading 2 Tm 2:8-13

Gospel Lk 17:11-19

**TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY:** Both our first reading and Gospel present us with stories of healing. Naaman the leper from Syria is healed by the prophet Elisha. On his way to Jerusalem Jesus heals ten lepers. However, the healing of leprosy is not the only common factor. Naaman is a foreigner. One of the lepers healed by Jesus is also not Jewish – one of the despised Samaritans. In both cases the Scriptures emphasise their gratitude to God. This is more pointed in the Gospel where it is contrasted with the ingratitude of Our Lord's fellow countrymen. We can think of the parallel with the woman who washed the feet of Jesus with her tears. She poured out her love because she realised how much she had been forgiven. Gratitude is an important gift and virtue. It is a gift because God helps us to realise that we have freely received something rather than claim it as an entitlement. It is a virtue because saying 'thank you' is something we must choose to do. Showing our thanks and appreciation to God and to other people is not just good manners. It is important and makes such a difference to life.
