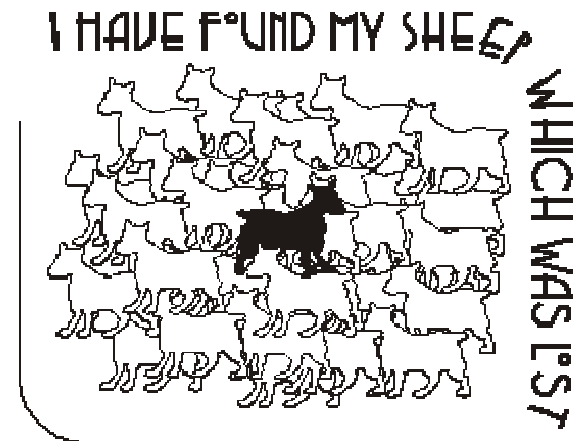

Twenty-fourth Sunday of Year

There will be rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner

First Reading	Ex 32:7-11.13-14

24TH SUNDAY OF YEAR: Each of the readings today brings out God's wish for every human being to be saved - the fullness of life that only he can give us both here on earth and in eternity. In the first reading we are told of God's mercy despite the rebellion of his Chosen People and their worship of the golden calf. In the Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the Prodigal Son. In the second reading St Paul describes himself as a great sinner but one spared by the grace and love of God. For him this is a sign of God's inexhaustible patience with frail human beings. If God can show such patience and forgiveness he must love us very much! But he does not force himself on us – he sends the Holy Spirit to prompt us but he waits for us to turn to him. Whatever your past failings never despair of God's love!

PAPAL VISIT: Please pray for the Holy Father each day this week as he and we prepare for his visit. You will find a full schedule in the gold 'Magnificat' prayer books. If you have not yet taken one, please do – they are free. I understand that the BBC will be showing the Masses at Bellahouston Park on Thursday, Westminster Cathedral on Saturday and at Cofton Park, Birmingham, on Sunday, but not the Vigil at Hyde Park. However, those who have satellite TV may be able to watch these and other events on EWTN. We shall be represented by 17 parishioners (+ Fr David Reynish!) at Hyde Park – and also Niamh Costello as part of the Youth representation, and by 3 (+ two who are going as Diocesan representatives) at Cofton Park. The Sunday is dedicated to the spread of the Gospel in England and Wales. The second collection will support the work of Home Mission. Funds raised last year have helped to make possible substantial outreach work in support of the Papal Visit. During the year ahead, the collection will help to build on the fruits of Pope Benedict's coming. A series of follow up events and initiatives are diarised. The money raised will also support the work of the Catholic Enquiry Office as a national point of contact for faith enquirers.
