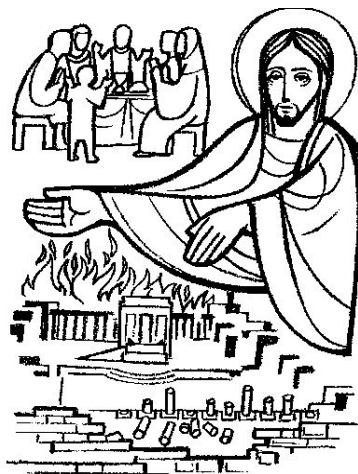
Your endurance will win you your lives

33RD SUNDAY: In today's Gospel Our Lord looks ahead to the final Judgement when he will come again in glory. He warns that before this comes to pass there will be many different kinds of disaster on earth, both natural and man-made. However, we must not jump to conclusions and identify events of our own day with these 'End times'. Many will try to deceive us in this way. What matters is not when this will happen but that we are ready and do not allow such things to shake our faith. The Prophet Malachi uses the image of stubble burning. Those who are middle-aged will remember how, until environmental concerns led to the banning of the practice, every Autumn you would see a line of fire dancing across the fields as the farmers burned off the stubble to prepare for ploughing and planting the next crop. For Malachi it is a purifying and cleansing fire that prepares the way for new life. In the same way the 'Day of the Lord' will usher in God's Kingdom in a definitive way and sickness and death will be banished for ever in a transformed universe.

PUTTING OUR PLANS INTO ACTION!

The post mission meeting on 6th October was a vibrant and very-well attended meeting. It was full of wonderful testimony as to how valuable the Mission had been to all who attended. Below are some notes that summarise what was shared during the meeting:

Post Mission Meeting Minutes – Wednesday 6th October 2010

Sharing of experience of mission: where did I meet the Lord?

- Visiting: Holy Spirit at work; felt the strong presence of the Spirit during visits
- People's thirst for God, even through their brokenness
- Prayer: both in preparation for mission and during the mission; this resulted in many miracles being accomplished in the parish
- Sense of community and communion; working together – unity and warmth.
- Parish involvement: during the pre-mission process, many chose to come together and work to make mission possible.
- Prayer Group: a prayer group was started as a result of the mission; it is still going strong.
- All night vigil
- Evening services awoke a sense of God inside individuals; people experienced the presence of God within them. It also brought a challenge: how is the Lord calling each person into relationship with Him?
- The dramas during the services enable people to experience the Gospel in a different way; it also enabled people to reflect on Scripture.

Ways to help us grow/develop/nurture/sustain our faith in the Parish.

- Series of lectures/ teaching evenings on specific topics relating to my faith
- Adult formation: learning more about what it is that I believe in as well as developing my understanding of God
- Sharing group: a space where I am able to share with others and support one another in our journey
- Parish Council: a place where we not only make decisions to help our faith grow but also a place filled with prayer and listening to God.
- Develop the ministries within the Parish: Readers, Altar servers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist.
- Organising retreat days/prayer days or away days as a place of renewal and also used as a 'time out with God'.
- Monthly ecumenical prayer group.
- Mum's group as a space for sharing and socialising.
- Visiting: to develop a way of reaching out to the wider community.
