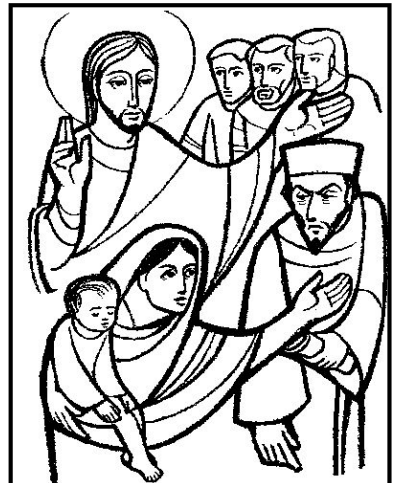
*God will see justice done to his chosen

**TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY:** The theme of prayer runs through the readings both today and next Sunday, when the first reading will draw together today's image of the cry of the widow for justice and next week's of the humble man at prayer. Today the emphasis is on perseverance. It has been said that prayer is 99% perspiration and 1% inspiration. We can be inclined to give up on prayer either because we do not find it a rewarding experience or because our prayer seems to go unanswered. This week we have an answer to desperate prayer in a Chilean mine – from the trapped miners and their families, and from all who have supported them by prayer throughout the world. For many days they had no one to turn to but God until the first break through that established they were still alive. Even then so much could go wrong. When our energies are flagging we need the support of others praying for us. This is shown in a direct and physical way in our first reading where Aaron and Hur hold up Moses' arms. It is also implicit in the parable Jesus tells. The word translated 'worry' literally means 'give someone a black eye', but the emphasis is more on the daily wearing down. Justice was not a private affair. The local people would see the judge denying justice to the widow day by day and sooner or later public disapprobation would make itself felt.
