FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Jesus is born of Mary who was betrothed to Joseph, son of David.

First Reading: Is 7:10-14

Responsorial Psalm PS 23:1-6

Second Reading: Rm 1:1-7

Gospel: Mt 1:18-24



FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT: The readings today focus on the role of Our Lady. God could have chosen to appear among us in human form but without truly sharing our human nature – a kind of vision or apparition like those of the pagan gods. He could have chosen to rescue us and restore us to favour by decree. However, this was not his choice. He chose to take our human nature to himself – to become as all human beings are except for sin. For this to happen he needed the co-operation of a woman to be his mother. Mary's role guarantees that Jesus is truly human. At the same time, if Jesus had a natural human father, in what sense would he be son of God? So that his divinity should not be questioned God fulfils the sign promised to Ahaz. Mary will conceive Jesus in a miraculous way through the power of the Holy Spirit.

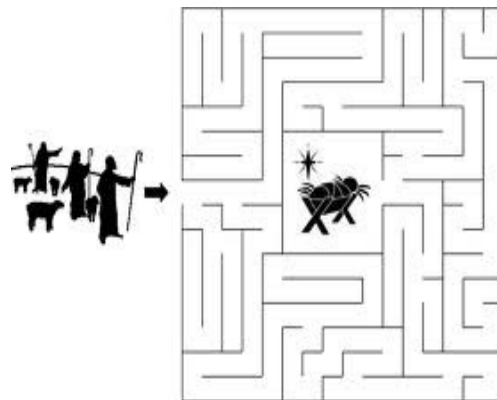
