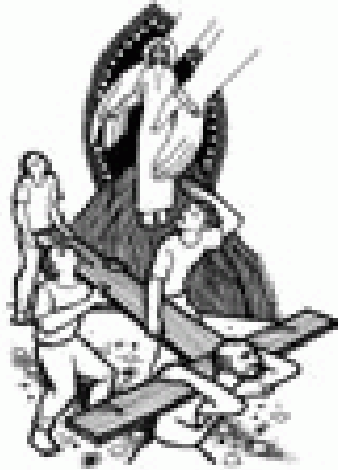

Twelfth Sunday of Year

*You are the Christ of God.
The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously*

First Reading	Zc 12:10-11;13:1
Responsorial Psalm	Ps 62:2-6.8-9

Gospel	Lk 9:18-24

12TH SUNDAY OF YEAR: “Who do the crowds say I am?” St Matthew focuses not only on Simon Peter’s answer but his future role. St Luke passes over this and concentrates on the implications of acknowledging him as the Lord’s anointed one. The Messiah must suffer and be put to death before rising to new life on the third day. His followers must also expect a share in the cross. Jesus adds “every day”. Why? We will not necessarily experience suffering every day, but the way to be ready for it when it comes is spiritual preparation. If we are able to say ‘no’ to ourselves daily in small things we will be steered to accept the cross when we have no choice. Remember the words of Our Lord to Peter, “When you are old someone will put a belt around you and take you where you would rather not go.” Hopefully we all make the sign of the cross at least when we get up and go to bed. When we do this, make it a sign that you are accepting the cross. Ask the Lord to help you to accept the troubles and difficulties that the day will bring – or has brought. Ask him to help you make some little act of self-denial today – perhaps through time given to another or patience shown towards them.
